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URGENT MESSAGE FROM THE MCPS SCHOOL SYSTEM MEDICAL OFFICER

DECEMBER 9, 2022

Dear MCPS Community,

I am reaching out to make sure students, staff, and families are aware of a very dangerous trend in substance use affecting our community. Synthetic opioids, specifically illegally made fentanyl, are increasingly responsible for overdoses and overdose deaths. In 2021, over 70% of all overdoses in Montgomery County were fentanyl related including substances laced with fentanyl or substances that look like something else (e.g., Xanax, Adderall, Percocet, or oxycodone) but had fentanyl in them. MCPS continues to work diligently alongside local government authorities and community partners on a comprehensive and coordinated approach to this dangerous epidemic.

What is illicit fentanyl?

Fentanyl is a prescription medication for pain that is 50-100 times more powerful than morphine. The type of fentanyl driving overdose deaths is illegally made and sold in the form of powder, pills, liquid, or nasal sprays. Other drug products like marijuana, cocaine, heroin or illegally sold pills thought to be prescription medicine may be laced with illicit fentanyl, without the knowledge of the user.

Why are youth taking drugs, such as fentanyl and how are they getting them?

Teenagers and even younger children may use illicit substances for multiple reasons.

Experimentation or peer pressure may prompt a single episode of use that leads to further problems. Youth struggling with mental health symptoms, pain, or already using other drugs may be more likely to experiment or have problems related to substance use. With fentanyl, it is important to know that individuals may not even know they are taking it, as it is often incorporated into other substances. Drug traffickers may use fentanyl to increase the potency of their products.

2022-2023 Advocacy Priorities Back-Up Information

Mission: To make every child's potential a reality by engaging and empowering families and communities to advocate for all children.

CIP Priorities:

- Funding CIP: Advocate for State and County Legislators to increase the capital budgets to
 reduce overcrowding, renovate or replace buildings that have exceeded their lifecycle, and
 maintain existing infrastructure. Encourage County Council to review and enhance revenue
 sources to compensate for lost funding resulting from council enacted policies that reduced
 impact tax rates and borrowing capacity. All funds should be spent equitably throughout the
 county.
- Prioritizing Projects: MCPS should engage students, staff, and school communities when gathering KFI (Key Facility Indicator) data so that it transparently reflects the full school experience before making recommendations for Major Capital Projects in the capital budget, like the Operating Budget. Consider the socioeconomic makeup of the school population as an important factor when prioritizing projects, along with the condition and overutilization of buildings. Strive to use available facilities more efficiently by engaging with MCCPTA and school communities to consider all available options to reduce disparities in the utilization of school facilities across the county. Monitor and publicly post air, water, and field quality at schools. Equitably update schools as necessary to provide comfortable schools with clean air, water, and safe outdoor infrastructure, prioritize HVAC projects and other quality of life and safety projects in the CIP Budget.
- Safe Routes: Increase the number of crossing guards and improve surrounding
 infrastructure to provide safe pedestrian and biking routes to school, following the Vision
 Zero model. Bus stop locations and surrounding infrastructure should be reviewed for safety,
 with consideration of traffic conditions and the need for protective barriers such as bollards.
 Ensure adequate buses and drivers to prevent overcrowding and abandoned routes. Ensure
 coordination between MCPS. MDOT and other agencies to ensure safe routes to school.
- Sustainability and Green Schools: MCCPTA will work with MCPS, county planning and
 community partners to meet the goals of the MCPS Sustainability Policy and of the 2017
 Climate Action Resolution of reducing carbon emissions by 80% by 2027 and 100% by 2035,
 and 100% participation in the MD Green Schools Program by 2035.

Curriculum Priorities:

- Communication:
 - Ensure clear, simple, accurate, and timely communication to our diverse population in multiple languages and through multiple channels regarding the education (including progress of learning recovery, performance metrics, selection criteria, standards, curriculum content and changes, and school/program choice options) and wellbeing of Montgomery County Public Schools (MCPS) students.
 - Implement feedback tools and procedures to eliminate the inequities speakers of other languages experience in participating in their student's education.


